Chair and Psychiatrist Members Alberta Review Board

Alberta Justice and Solicitor General, Alberta. As a member of the Board, you will contribute to fair and expeditious hearings conducted in accordance with the requirements of the *Criminal Code* and principles of natural justice. Along with your panel co-members, you will consider oral and written evidence and submissions, assess the credibility of expert and lay witnesses, and apply statute and common law to the facts and merits of cases before you.

Chair responsibilities include:

- Ongoing jurisdiction over individuals who have received verdicts of not criminally responsible or unfit to stand trial on account of mental disorder.
- Acting as an independent and impartial decision maker adjudicating dispositions.
- Conducting hearings within statutory timelines as well as annually to reassess whether an individual poses a significant threat to the public.
- Determining whether an individual should be subject to a detention order, a conditional discharge, granted an absolute discharge or found fit to stand trial.

Board member responsibilities include:

- Hearing psychiatric and other evidence and basing decisions on the safety of the public and the reintegration of the accused into society.
- Applying fair, transparent, consistent, and principled decision making.
- Managing challenging and sensitive issues with impartiality, objectiveness, and sound judgment.
- Analyzing complex information and varying points of view.
- Assessing cases, reaching consensus and conclusions as a member of a panel, while considering the applicable legislation.
